March Madness Bingo Rules

How to Play:

1. The general idea is to finish projects between March 19th and April 8 that satisfy squares on the board and form at least one Bingo (a set of five consecutive squares, running vertically, horizontally, or diagonally).
2. **IMPORTANT:** To qualify for prizes, projects must use yarn purchased at Northfield Yarn.
3. The projects can be current WIPs or projects cast on during March Madness. Regardless of their start date, they must be completely finished by April 8th to satisfy any squares. (Blocking doesn't matter, but ends must be woven in — unless you plan to leave them hanging forever!)
4. It is possible to get a Bingo with a single project, but that is not required; the 5 squares forming a Bingo can be satisfied with a combination of multiple projects.
5. The only square that does not require a completed project is the central square, N3.
6. As you play, X out the squares that you've satisfied, and keep a list of completed projects and the squares that they satisfy.
 - For example, if you completed a blue alpaca shawl for yourself, you might write down, *"Shawl for me: B3, N2, G4, O3"*
7. There is no limit to how many squares a completed project can satisfy, as long the same attribute isn't used in two different ways. For example:
 - A project with green and white stripes can satisfy B2 and B3, but a project that is brownish-green can satisfy either B3 or B5, but not both.
 - A project with a cable in one place and stockinette somewhere else can satisfy I4 and I5, but an all-over cabled project cannot satisfy both I4 and I5 just because there are a couple of reverse stockinette stitches in between the cables.
8. Additional clarification for square N4: These patterns can be found in [Northfield Yarn's Ravelry Store](#), or as samples in the shop.

How to Win:

1. Some time between March 19th and Saturday, April 13th (we're giving you a few extra days to get to the shop), bring in:
 - your completed Bingo card
 - your list of projects (see #5, above), and
 - either the actual project(s), photograph(s), or Ravelry projects with photos
2. Northfield Yarn will double-check your card and give you a reward if you have completed at least one Bingo. Multiple Bingos do not qualify for multiple rewards, but they do get you multiple entries for the Grand Prize (see #3, below).
3. If you would like to be entered to win the Grand Prize (with a retail value of over \$75), Northfield Yarn will record your contact information and your number of entries. You will be entered once for every completed Bingo on your card (up to a maximum of 12 entries for a fully completed card).
4. The prize drawing will take place after closing on Saturday, April 13th, and the winner will be contacted immediately.

Final, most important rule: Have fun! :)
