## March Madness Bingo Rules

## How to Play:

- 1. The general idea is to finish projects between March 15th and April 6 that satisfy squares on the board and form at least one Bingo (a set of five consecutive squares, running vertically, horizontally, or diagonally).
- 2. IMPORTANT: To qualify for prizes, projects must use yarn purchased at Northfield Yarn.
- 3. The projects can be current WIPs or projects cast on during March Madness. Regardless of their start date, they must be completely finished by midnight April 6th to satisfy any squares. (Blocking doesn't matter, but ends must be woven in.)
- 4. It is possible to get a Bingo with a single project, but that is not required; the 5 squares forming a Bingo can be satisfied with a combination of multiple projects.
- 5. The only square that does not require a completed project is the central square, N3.
- 6. As you play, keep a numbered list of completed projects, and write the number corresponding to the project in the square(s) that the project satisfies.
  - For example, if the first project you completed is a blue baby hat to donate, you could write a "1" in squares B2, B4, G3, G4, and O4 (maybe more, depending on the project).
- 7. There is no limit to how many squares a completed project can satisfy, as long the same attribute isn't used in two different ways. For example:
  - A project with red and green stripes can satisfy G1 and G3, but a blueish purple can satisfy either G1 or G3, not both.
- 8. Additional clarification for square N4: These patterns can be found in <u>Northfield Yarn's</u> Ravelry Store, or as samples in the shop.

## How to Win:

- 1. By 5:30pm on Saturday, April 11th (we're giving you a few days to get to the shop), bring in:
  - · your completed Bingo card
  - · your list of projects (see #6, above), and
  - either the actual project(s), photograph(s), or Ravelry projects with photos
- 2. Northfield Yarn will double-check your card and give you a reward if you have completed at least one Bingo. Multiple Bingos do not qualify for multiple rewards, but they do get you multiple entries for the Grand Prize (see #3, below).
- 3. If you would like to be entered to win the Grand Prize (with a retail value of over \$75), Northfield Yarn will record your contact information and your number of entries. You will be entered once for every completed Bingo on your card (up to a maximum of 12 entries for a fully completed card).
- 4. The prize drawing will take place after closing on Saturday, April 11th, and the winner will be contacted immediately.

Final, most important rule: Have fun!:)
